• Change our <u>mental</u> models.

Romans 12:2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind so that you may prove what is God's will, his good, pleasing and perfect.

• Change our <u>action</u> models.

Matt. 28:19 ... *Go and make disciples of all nations, teaching them to obey everything...*

Real growth comes from <u>application</u>.

Real growth comes from <u>precept</u> or <u>pain</u>.

1. We want to have our <u>own way</u>.

Proverbs 1:30-^{...} since they would not accept my advice and spurned

my rebuke, ³¹ *they will eat the fruit of their ways and be filled with the fruit of their schemes.*

Strategies to Dodge Correction

1. You ignore it.

Proverbs 13:18 He who ignores discipline comes to poverty and shame, but whoever heeds correction is honored.

Discipline:

Proverbs 10:8 The wise in heart accept commands, but a chattering fool comes to ruin.

2. Being wise in our own eyes.

Prov. 26:12 *Do you see a man wise in how own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him!*

Prov. 12:15 *There is a way that seems right to a man but in the end it leads to death.*

3. <u>Resists</u>: Stiffen your neck.

 Prov. 29:1 He who is often reproved, yet stiffens his neck will be suddenly broken beyond healing.

4. We scorn it; ridicule; mocking; disdaining.

Proverbs 19:16 *He who obeys instructions guards his life, but he who is contemptuous of his ways will die.*

Titus 3:2 For we also once were foolish, disobedient, deceived, and enslaved by various lusts and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another.
