Building

5 Chapters of Your Life

When you were a kid life looked *simple*. When you became a teen, you began to realize that life was *painful*. But when you became an adult you should have realized that life was *hard*. It is. It's supposed to be. This week we'll look at why that's true and why that's a good thing! God is *building* something in you through a tough life.

DAY 1

After Adam and Eve rebelled against God, deciding to take life into their own hands, all of life changed. This is what theologians call "the Fall." Instead of the Garden of Eden, an idyllic paradise where they could enjoy each other's and God's company, as well as tend the garden, they found the following seismic shift...

Genesis 3:17 To Adam he said, "Because you listened to your wife and ate from the tree about which I commanded you, 'You must not eat of it,' "Cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat of it all the days of your life.¹⁸ It will produce thorns and thistles for you, and you will eat the plants of the field.¹⁹ By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return."

2. Back in Genesis 2:15, prior to the Fall, God "put Adam in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it." What phrase in v. 3:17 describes the kind of effort it's now going to take?

3. What specifics does God give to Adam in 3:18?

4. Have you ever weeded a garden or flower plot? What is that like?

5. How often does a garden patch have to be weeded?

6. Is this story just bad news for farmers or gardeners, or is God describing a new reality across every facet of life? How does this strike you?

7. What are some current "weeds, thorns, or thistles" in your life? Do you have some "gardening" to do, today?

DAY 2

The important things in life do not come easily. Marriages are not made; they are built. Children are not made; they are built. Careers are not made; they are built. Your ministry is not made; it is something you build. Building wealth is not made; it is built. Growing into Christ-likeness is not something that is made; it is something that is built. In all these endeavors you and God are co-laborers!

DAY 3

One of the "paths" of our native foolishness is what is called, "the simpleton." The "simple" person underestimates the complexities and difficulties of life.

Proverbs 1:22 "How long will you simple ones love your simple ways? How long will mockers delight in mockery and fools hate knowledge?

Proverbs 1:32 *For the waywardness of the simple will kill them, and the complacency of fools will destroy them;*

Proverbs 8:5 You who are simple, gain prudence; you who are foolish, gain understanding.

Proverbs 9:6 Leave your simple ways and you will live; walk in the way of understanding.

Proverbs 9:16 "Let all who are simple come in here!" she says to those who lack judgment (from the adulteress!)

Proverbs 14:15 A simple man believes anything, but a prudent man gives thought to his steps.

Proverbs 14:18 *The simple inherit folly, but the prudent are crowned with knowledge.*

Proverbs 27:12 The prudent see danger and take refuge, but the simple keep going and suffer for it.

Matthew 28:18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.¹⁹ Therefore, as you are going <u>make disciples</u> of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; ...

DAY 5

Ephesians 4:11 And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip <u>the saints</u> for the <u>work of ministry</u>, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ <u>until we all</u> attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to <u>mature</u> manhood, to the measure of the <u>stature of the fullness of Christ</u>; ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the cunning of men, by their craftiness in deceitful wiles. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every joint with which it is supplied, when <u>each part is working properly</u>, makes bodily growth and <u>upbuilds itself in love</u>.
