■ Attitude toward our brothers: "Judge\_not..."

Matthew 7:1 "Do not judge, or you too will be judged."

James 4:12 There is only one Lawgiver and Judge, Him who is able to save and destroy. But you--who are you to judge your neighbor?

# Attitude to brothers: don't be a <u>hypocrite</u>. Matt. 7:3 "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust

## Attitude to fools: watch what you say.

Matt. 7:6 "Do not give dogs what is sacred; do not throw your pearls to pigs. If you do, they may trample them under their feet, and then turn and tear you to pieces."

2 Peter 2:22 Of them the proverbs are true: "A dog returns to its vomit," and, "A sow that is washed goes back to her wallowing in the mud."

Proverbs 29:9 If a wise man has an argument with a fool, the fool only rages and laughs, and there is no quiet.
