1. The taproot of fear

<u>Fear</u> is fueled by a priority belief that <u>**I** may not get</u>, get the "<u>life</u>" I believe I <u>need</u> and <u>deserve</u> in order to be happy.

Job 3:25 "What I feared has come upon me; what I dreaded has happened to me.

Job 3:26 I have no peace, no quietness; I have no rest, but only turmoil."

2. Fear: the loss of perceived ______.

Job 21:6 When I think about this, I am terrified; trembling seizes my body.

⁷ Why do the wicked live on, growing old and increasing in power? ⁸ They see their children established around them, their offspring before their eyes.
