Romans 4:18 Against all hope, Abraham in hope <u>believed</u> and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

¹⁹ Without weakening in his <u>faith</u>, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead--since he was about a hundred years old--and that Sarah's womb was also dead.

Romans 4:20 No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God,

²¹ fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised.

²² This is why "it was <u>credited to him as righteousness</u>."

²³ *The words "it was <u>credited</u> to him" were written not for him alone,*

²⁴ but also for us, to whom God <u>will credit righteousness</u>--for us who <u>believe</u> in him who <u>raised</u> Jesus our Lord <u>from the</u> <u>dead</u>.

²⁵ He was delivered over to death for our sins and was <u>raised</u> <u>to life for</u> our justification.

Are justified by works? (4:1-8)

Romans 4:1 What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather, discovered in this matter? ² If, in fact, Abraham was justified by works, he had something to boast about--but not before God.

"Justified" -

Romans 4:3 What does the Scripture say? "Abraham <u>believed</u> God, and it was <u>credited</u> to him as <u>righteousness</u>."

Genesis 15:4 Then the word of the LORD came to him: "This man will not be your heir, but a son coming from your own body will be your heir."

⁵ He took him outside and said, "Look up at the heavens and count the stars--if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

Genesis 15:6 Abram believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness.

"Believed" -

"Credited"-

Romans 4:4 Now when a man works, his wages are not credited to him as a gift, but as an obligation.

Romans 4:5 However, to the man who does not work but trusts God who justifies the wicked, his faith is credited as righteousness.

Romans 4:6 David says the same thing when he speaks of the blessedness of the man to whom God credits righteousness apart from works:

⁷ "Blessed are they whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.

⁸ Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord will never count against him."

Are we justified by religious action? (4:9-12)

Romans 4:9 Is this blessedness only for the circumcised, or also for the uncircumcised? We have been saying that Abraham's faith was credited to him as righteousness.

¹⁰ Under what circumstances was it credited? Was it after he was circumcised, or before? It was not after, but before!

¹¹ And he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of <u>the</u> <u>righteousness that he had by faith</u> while he was still uncircumcised. So then, he is the <u>father</u> of all who believe but have <u>not</u> been circumcised, in order that <u>righteousness</u> might be <u>credited</u> to <u>them</u>.

¹² And he is also the father of the circumcised who not only are circumcised but who also walk in the <u>footsteps of the</u> <u>faith</u> that our father Abraham had before he was circumcised.

We are _____righteous by God (4:13-16)

Romans 4:13 It was not through law that Abraham and his offspring received the **promise** that he would be heir of the world, but through <u>the righteousness</u> that <u>comes by faith</u>.

¹⁴ For if those who live by law are heirs, faith has no value and the *promise* is worthless,

¹⁵ because law brings wrath. And where there is no law there is no transgression.

We are declared righteous by _____.

Romans 4:16 Therefore, the promise comes by faith, ...

We are declared righteous by _____.

...so that it may be <u>by grace</u> and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring--not only to those who are of the law but also to those who are of <u>the faith</u> of Abraham. He is the father of us all.

Salvation: the spiritually____are made____! (4:17-25)

Romans 4:17 As it is written: "I have made you a father of many nations." He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he <u>believed</u>--the God <u>who gives life to the dead</u> and calls things that are not as though they were.
