<sup>18</sup> Consequently, just as the result of one <u>trespass</u> was condemnation for all men, so also the result of one act of <u>righteousness</u> was justification that brings life for all men.

<sup>19</sup> For just as through the <u>disobedience</u> of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the <u>obedience</u> of the one man the many will be made righteous.

### As grace did abound... (5:20-21)

5:20 The law was added so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, **grace** increased all the more

Romans 5:21 ... so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

# The Blessings and Basis of Justification

# The blessings of justification

The blessed effects of justification (5:1-5)

Romans 5:1 Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have <u>peace</u> with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,

Isaiah 48:22 "There is no peace," says the LORD, "for the wicked."

Isaiah 32:17 And the effect of righteousness will be peace, and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust for ever.

Romans 5:2 ... through whom we have gained <u>access</u> by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God.

Access:

Grace.

Romans 5:3 Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; <sup>4</sup> perseverance, character; and character, hope.

### We are reconciled to God by His blood (5:6-11)

Romans 5:6 You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for <u>the ungodly</u>.

Romans 5:9 Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him!

# The basis of justification

## Death through Adam; life through Christ (5:12-14)

Romans 5:12 Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned--

<sup>13</sup> for before the law was given, sin was in the world. But sin is not taken into account when there is no law. <sup>14</sup> Nevertheless, death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those who did not sin by breaking a command, as did Adam, who was a pattern of the one to come.

# The grace of God has more power than Adam's sin had to bring misery (5:15-19)

Romans 5:15 But the **gift** is not like the **trespass**. For if the many died by the trespass of the one man, <u>how much more</u> did God's **grace** and the **gift** that came by the **grace** of the one man, Jesus Christ, overflow to the many!

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>8</sup> But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were <u>still sinners</u>, Christ died for us.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>10</sup> For if, when we were <u>God's enemies</u>, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> Not only is this so, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received **reconciliation**.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>16</sup> Again, the <u>gift</u> of God is not like the result of the one man's <u>sin</u>: The judgment followed one <u>sin</u> and brought condemnation, but the <u>gift</u> followed many trespasses and brought justification.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>17</sup> For if, by the <u>trespass</u> of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of <u>grace</u> and of the <u>gift</u> of righteousness <u>reign in life</u> through the one man, Jesus Christ.
