Zechariah and Elizabeth

Luke 1:5 In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, of the division of Abijah. And he had a wife from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth.

⁶ And they were <u>both righteous before God</u>, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and statutes of the Lord.

⁷ But they had <u>no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were advanced in years</u>.

⁸ Now while he was serving as priest before God when his division was on duty,

⁹ according to the custom of the priesthood, <u>he was chosen by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and</u> <u>burn incense</u>.

¹⁰ And the whole multitude of the people were praying outside at the hour of incense.

¹¹ And <u>there appeared to him an angel of the Lord</u> standing on the right side of the altar of incense. ¹² And Zechariah was troubled when he saw him, and fear fell upon him.

¹³ But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, <u>and your wife</u> <u>Elizabeth will bear</u>

¹⁴ And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, ¹⁵ for he will be great before the Lord.

¹⁶ And he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God,

¹⁷ and <u>he will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah</u>, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to <u>make ready for the Lord a people prepared</u>."

Malachi 4:5 "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and awesome day of the Lord comes.

⁶ And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction.

Luke 1:18 And Zechariah said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years."

¹⁹ And the angel answered him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news.

²⁰ And behold, <u>you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things take place, because</u> <u>you did not believe my words</u>, which will be fulfilled in their time."

²⁴ After these days <u>his wife Elizabeth conceived</u>, and for five months she kept herself hidden, saying,

²⁵ "Thus the Lord has done for me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among people."

Luke 1:57 Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and <u>she bore a son</u>. ⁵⁸ And her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown great mercy to her, and they <u>rejoiced with her</u>.

⁵⁹ And on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child. And they would have called him Zechariah after his father, ⁶⁰ but his mother answered, "<u>No; he shall be called John</u>."

⁶¹ And they said to her, "None of your relatives is called by this name." ⁶² And they made signs to his father, inquiring what he wanted him to be called.

⁶³ And he asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And <u>they all wondered</u>. ⁶⁴ And immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue loosed, <u>and he spoke, blessing God</u>.

⁶⁷ And his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, saying, ⁶⁸ "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people

⁶⁹ and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David, ⁷⁰ as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,
