has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising him from the dead."

Acts 17:32 When they heard about the resurrection of the dead, some of them sneered, but others said, "We want to hear you again on this subject."  $^{...34}$  A few men became followers of Paul and believed.

### Corinth, Ephesus, and return home

Acts 18:1 After this, Paul left Athens and went to Corinth.

Acts 18:5 When Silas and Timothy came from Macedonia, Paul devoted himself exclusively to preaching, testifying to the Jews that Jesus was the Christ.

Acts 18:7 Then Paul left the synagogue and went next door to the house of Titius Justus, a worshiper of God. <sup>8</sup> Crispus, the synagogue ruler, and <u>his entire household believed</u> in the Lord; and <u>many of the Corinthians</u> who heard him believed and were baptized.

Acts 18:9 One night the Lord spoke to Paul in a vision: "Do not be afraid; keep on speaking, do not be silent. <sup>10</sup> For I am with you, and no one is going to attack and harm you, because I have many people in this city." <sup>11</sup> So Paul stayed for a year and a half, teaching them the word of God.

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## Paul's 2nd Missionary Journey The Life and Ministry of Paul—part 7 August 7, 2016

### "Lord, Where Should We Go?"

Acts 16:6a Paul and his companions traveled throughout the <u>region</u> of Phrygia and <u>Galatia</u> having been kept by the Holy

Spirit from preaching the word in the province of Asia.

Acts 16:7 When they came to the border of Mysia, they tried to enter Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to. <sup>8</sup> So they passed by Mysia and went down to Troas.

Acts 16:9 During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us."

*Acts 16:10 After* **<u>Paul</u>** *had seen the vision,* <u>we got ready at</u> *once to leave for Macedonia, concluding that God had called* <u>us</u> *to preach the gospel to them.* 

# Philippi

Acts 16:14 One of those listening was a woman named Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth from the city of Thyatira, who was <u>a</u> <u>worshiper</u> of God. <u>The Lord opened her heart to respond</u> to <u>Paul's message</u>. <sup>15</sup> When she and the members of her household were baptized, she invited us to her home.

Acts 16:25 About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and

singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening
 to them.

Acts 16:26 Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose.

Acts 16:27 The jailer woke up, and when he saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself

because he thought the prisoners had escaped.

Acts 16:28 But Paul shouted, "Don't harm yourself! We are all here!"<sup>29</sup> The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas.<sup>30</sup> He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"<sup>31</sup> They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved--you and your household."

Acts 16:32 Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house. <sup>33</sup> At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then immediately he and all his family were baptized. <sup>34</sup> The jailer brought them into his house and set a meal before them; he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God--he and his whole family.

Acts 16:35 When it was daylight, the magistrates sent their officers to the jailer with the order: "Release those men."

Acts 16:36 The jailer told Paul, "The magistrates have ordered that you and Silas be released. Now you can leave. Go in peace."

#### **Thessalonica and Berea**

Acts 17:1 When they had passed through Amphipolis and Apollonia, they came to <u>Thessalonica</u>, where there was a Jewish synagogue.<sup>2</sup> As his custom was, Paul went into the synagogue, and on three Sabbath days he reasoned with them from the Scriptures,<sup>3</sup> explaining and proving that the

■ Christ had to suffer and rise from the dead. "This Jesus I am proclaiming to you is the Christ," he said.

<sup>4</sup> Some of the Jews were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, as did a large number of God-fearing Greeks and not a few prominent women.

Acts 17:10 As soon as it was night, the brothers sent Paul and Silas away to <u>Berea</u>. On arriving there, they went to the Jewish synagogue.<sup>11</sup> Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true. <sup>12</sup> Many of the Jews believed, as did also a number of prominent Greek women and many Greek men.

### Paul's sermon in Athens

Acts 17:16 While Paul was waiting for them in Athens, he was greatly distressed to see that the city was full of idols.

Acts 17:18 ... They said this because Paul was preaching the good news about Jesus and the resurrection.

- <sup>22</sup> Paul... said: "Men of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious.<sup>23</sup> For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. Now what you worship as something unknown I am going to proclaim to you.
  - <sup>24</sup> "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by hands. <sup>25</sup> And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed
- anything, because he himself gives all men life and breath and
  everything else.

<sup>26</sup> From one man he made every nation of men, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he determined the times set for them and the exact places where they should live.

- <sup>27</sup> God did this so that men would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from each one of us. <sup>28</sup> 'For in him we live and move and have our being.' As
- some of your own poets have said, 'We are his offspring.'<sup>29</sup> "Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone--an image made by man's design and skill.

<sup>30</sup> In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. <sup>31</sup> For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he
