Numbers 13:27 They gave Moses this account: "We went into the land to which you sent us, and it does flow with milk and honey! We even saw descendants of Anak there.... <sup>31</sup> But the men who had gone up with him said, "We can't attack those people; they are stronger than we are." <sup>32</sup> And they spread among the Israelites a bad report about the land they had explored. They said, "The land we explored devours those living in it. All the people we saw there are of great size. <sup>33</sup> We saw the Nephilim there....
