- **Psalms 21:2** You have granted him the desire of his heart and have not withheld the request of his lips.
- **Psalms 27:4** One thing I ask of the LORD, this is what I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to seek him in his temple.
- **Psalms 37:4** Delight yourself in the LORD and he will give you the desires of your heart.
- Psalms 42:1 As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, O God.
- **Psalms 63:1** O God, you are my God, earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you, my body longs for you, in a dry and weary land where there is no water.
- John 4:34 "My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work.
- **Psalms 40:8** I desire to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart."
- Hebrews 12:1 (RSV) Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, <sup>2</sup> looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. <sup>3</sup> Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.
