John 5:31 "If I testify about myself, my testimony is not valid. <sup>32</sup> There is another who testifies in my favor, and I know that his testimony about me is valid. <sup>33</sup> "You have sent to <u>John</u> and he <u>has testified to the truth</u>. <sup>35</sup> John was a lamp that burned and gave light, and you chose for a time to enjoy his light.

36 "I have testimony weightier than that of John. For the very work that the Father has given me to finish, and which I am doing, testifies that the Father has sent me.

<sup>37</sup> And <u>the Father</u> who sent me <u>has</u> himself <u>testified concerning</u> <u>me</u>. You have never heard his voice nor seen his form, <sup>38</sup> nor does his word dwell in you, for you do not believe the one he sent.

You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by them you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me, 40 yet you refuse to come to me to have life. 42 but I know you. I know that you do not have the love of God in your hearts. 43 I have come in my Father's name, and you do not accept me; but if someone else comes in his own name, you will accept him. 44 How can you believe if you accept praise from one another, yet make no effort to obtain the praise that comes from the only God?

<sup>45</sup> "But do not think I will accuse you before the Father. Your accuser is Moses, on whom your hopes are set. <sup>46</sup> If you believed Moses, you would believe me, for he wrote about me. <sup>47</sup> But since you do not believe what he wrote, how are you going to believe what I say?"

## The healed invalid and human nature (vv.1-15)

John 5:2 Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. <sup>3</sup> Here a <u>great number</u> of <u>disabled</u> people used to lie--the blind, the lame, the paralyzed. <sup>5</sup> One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years.

John 5:6 When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to get well?"

John 5:7 "Sir," the invalid replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me." John 5:8 Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk."

John 5:9a At once the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked.

#### An outward and inward look at human sin

■ John 5:9b The day on which this took place was a Sabbath, <sup>10</sup> and so the Jews said to the man who had been healed, "It is the Sabbath; the law forbids you to carry your mat."

John 5:11 But he replied, "The man who made me well said to me, 'Pick up your mat and walk.'" <sup>12</sup> So they asked him, "Who is this fellow who told you to pick it up and walk?"

■ John 5:13 The man who was healed had no idea who it was, for Jesus had slipped away into the crowd that was there.

John 5:14 Later Jesus found him at the temple and said to him, "See, you are well again. Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you."

# Life-giving Father and Son (vv. 16-23)

John 5:16 So, <u>because</u> Jesus was doing these things on <u>the</u> <u>Sabbath</u>, the Jews <u>persecuted him</u>.

John 5:17 Jesus said to them, "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I, too, am working."

<sup>18</sup> For this reason the Jews tried all the harder to kill him; not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God.

John 5:19 Jesus gave them this answer: "I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he

sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does. <sup>20</sup> For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, to your amazement he will show him even greater things than these.

John 5:22 Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son, <sup>23</sup> that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him.

John 5:21 For just as the Father raises the dead and <u>gives</u> <u>them life</u>, even so <u>the Son gives life</u> to whom he is pleased to give it.
