¹¹ as you help us by your prayers. Then many will give thanks on our behalf for the gracious favor granted us in answer to the prayers of many.
God draws us "up" to Himself. Our greatest and highest connection is "upward," with God, but it is often made "more real" through redemptive conversations with His people.

"Redemptive Relating:" With, for, toward, in, up.

God relates to us to elevate our hearts <u>UP</u> to Him as first priority and first love. We powerfully relate to others when we help awaken someone's hidden desire to know God and live for Him above anything else.

What traits is God is building in His people?

Isaiah 55:1 "<u>Come</u>, all you who are <u>thirsty</u>, <u>come</u> to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! <u>Come</u>, buy wine and milk without money and without cost.

Psalm 37:4 Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart. ⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him and he will do this...

"Consider"-

Questions to ask yourself:

What is going on deeper in my friend?

What inner battles is he waging?

What stirs in me, as he shares his story?

What resonates with your inner story?

What does God seem to be shaping in my friend?

What deeper desires is God awakening?

About what are you more curious? What else would you like to know?

What does he wish would be different about his response to his challenge?

"Stir up" –

A case study: Paul

How would you respond to Paul's inner story?

2 Corinthians 1:8 We don't want you to be uninformed, brothers, about the <u>hardships</u> we <u>suffered</u> in the province of Asia...

We were under <u>great pressure</u>, <u>far beyond our ability</u> to <u>endure</u>, so that <u>we despaired even of life</u>.
