Job's story

Job 1:1 In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was <u>blameless</u> and <u>upright</u>; he <u>feared God</u> and <u>shunned evil</u>.² He had seven sons and three daughters, ³ and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen and five hundred donkeys, and had a large number of servants. He was <u>the</u> <u>greatest man</u> among all the people of the East. Job 1:20 At this, Job got up and tore his robe and shaved his head. Then he fell to the ground in worship²¹ and said: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away; may the name of the LORD be praised."

²² In all this, Job did not sin by charging God with wrongdoing.

Job 42:1 Then Job replied to the LORD: ² "I know that you can do all things; no purpose of yours can be thwarted. ³ You asked, 'Who is this that obscures my plans without knowledge?' Surely I spoke of things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know.⁴ "You said, 'Listen now, and I will speak; I will question you, and you shall answer me.' ⁵ My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. ⁶ Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes."
