Responsibility #1: H God.

Deut. 17:1 Do not sacrifice to the Lord your God an ox or a sheep that has any defect or flaw in it, for that would be detestable to him.

Proverbs 3:9 <u>Honor the Lord with your wealth</u>, with <u>the first fruits</u> of all your crops; [10] then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine.

It's a matter of priority, of highest value.

Responsibility #2: Pay your bills ASAP.
