God gives meaning in your <u>everyday</u> life as you make Him first thing priority.

Mark 8:36 What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?

Proverbs 27:20 Hell and destruction are never satisfied, and never satisfied are the eyes of man.

Am I giving from trusted fulness or grasping for demanded fulness?

#### The Ecclesiastes-Experience

Ecclesiastes 1:1 The words of the Teacher, son of David, king in Jerusalem:

<sup>2</sup> "Meaningless! Meaningless!" says the Teacher. "Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless."

Ecclesiastes 2:1 I thought in my heart, "Come now, I will test you with <u>pleasure</u> to find out what is good."

Eccl. 2:1 ...But that also proved to be meaningless.

Ecclesiastes 2:2 "Laughter," I said, "is foolish. And what does pleasure accomplish?"

#### Pleasure on demand

Ecclesiastes 2:3 I tried cheering myself with wine, and embracing folly--my mind still guiding me with wisdom. I wanted to see what was worthwhile for men to do under heaven during the few days of their lives.

Eccl. 2:8...I acquired men and women singers, ...

Eccl. 2:8 ... and a harem as well--the delights of the heart of man.

Mark 8:35 For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. <sup>36</sup> What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?

#### **Emptiness too great for man's greatest efforts**

Eccl. 2:9 I became greater by far than anyone in Jerusalem before me. In all this my wisdom stayed with me.
