# 1. Does someone hold something against me that I need to clear up?

If not sure, ask. "I may be being overly sensitive; is there something I've done to offend you?"

# 2. What was the basic offense done against someone?

Ungrateful Selfish Disrespectful Stubborn Rebellious Harsh Lying Proud Unkind

### 3. Ask Them to Forgive You.

"I realize that I have been wrong in \_\_\_\_\_(basic offense). Will you forgive me?"

#### **Conclusion:**

Reconciliation takes humility, mercy, and grace.

Would you commit yourself to pursue a clear conscience? List names, offenses, then start with the hardest and move to the easiest. Bowed heads. Pray. Commitment by standing.

Acts 24:16 So I <u>strive</u> always to keep my conscience clear before God and man.

What is a Clear Conscience?

The inner freedom from knowing that no one can point a finger at you and accuse you of wrongs toward him that you have not made <u>right</u>, or tried to make right.

- How Not to Gain a Clear Conscience
  - "I was wrong but you were too."
  - "I'm sorry," or, "I apologize."
- Quick "apology"
  - "<u>If</u> I've been wrong, please forgive me."

1 John 4:20 If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. [21] And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother.

1 Peter 3:7 Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will <u>hinder your prayers</u>.

# 2. The past is not "past" until you've t\_\_\_\_\_to\_reconcile.

<u>Pretending</u> it didn't happen is neither forgiveness nor being reconciled.

1 John 1:9 <u>If</u> we <u>confess</u> our sins, he is faithful and just and will <u>forgive</u> us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
